1. What do you like to collect? Please draw or write it down for us.



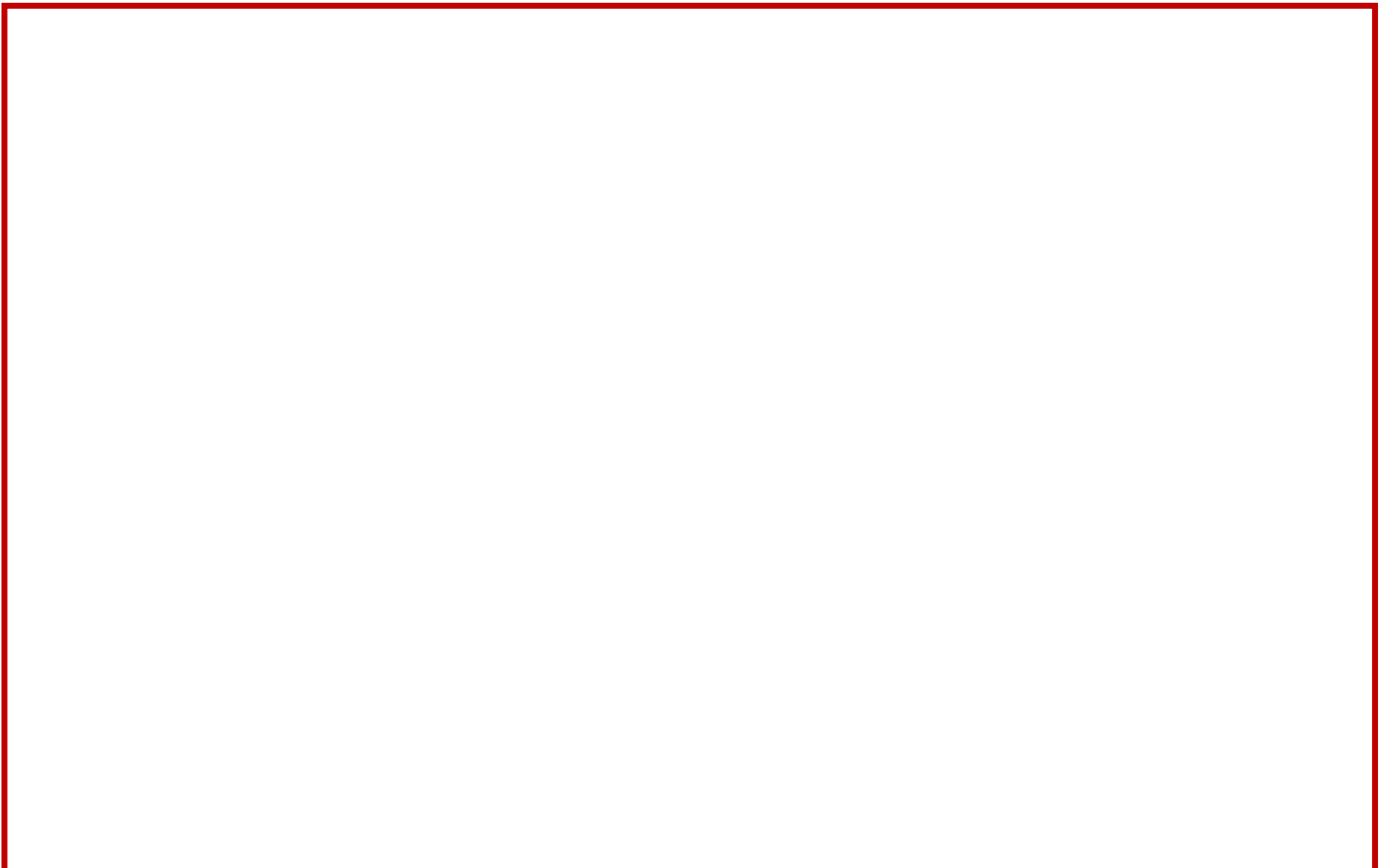
1. **Your digital journey starts at the me Café.** Can you spot the portraits? How many heads can you count?

2. **Go to the first room of the exhibition.** Look around carefully: Can you find the figures of the drinking women? How many are there?

3. There is a painted figure **in the same room.** She/he is wearing a blue dress. Have you already found the painting? What is the colour of her/his hair?

4. **For the next question, we are asking you to go to the next room:** Here you will find the collector's apartment. Take your time, have a look around... there is so much to discover! There is an animal skin carpet in one room, which animal is it?

In fact, there are so many more animals to discover within the apartment. Can you believe it – we already found more than 30 animals. How many can you spot? Which one do you like the most? Please draw your favourite for us:



6. **At the end of the second hall** the MOVING ENERGIES exhibition ends and it continues with *Gerhard Richter*: Have a look at the paintings and pictures in the room. Some of them are consisting of squares in different colours. We are now looking for a specific painting with 25 coloured squares, two of them are pink. Can you name the colours of the squares in the four corners?

7. **In the next area** you will find works that are much larger in size than those that you have seen before. Also, here no canvases are used as support, rather a different material has been chosen: Do you know how these artworks were created? And what do we have here?

Tip – They are mostly made of wool.

8. Finally, we have a counting task for you. In the *Gerhard Richter* exhibition almost all the picture frames are white, only a few are black, how many?
